Montreal, Monday, October 29, 2018 – Every two years, <u>CINARS</u> organizes one of the most important international gatherings of the performing arts in Montreal. From November 12 to 17, the 18th edition of the <u>CINARS Biennale</u> will bring together more than **1550 performing arts professionals** hailing from the four corners of the world. This event serves as a major platform that facilitates the dissemination of Quebec and international creations beyond their borders and also shines a light on the cultural life of Montreal. The CINARS Biennale is also an opportunity for the public to discover the performing arts free of charge with an official selection of shows in **dance, theatre, music, circus, and multidisciplinary arts**. This edition promises to be even more festive as CINARS is celebrating its 35th anniversary!

This year, the organization is proud to pay homage to one of our most prolific artists who is a great ambassador of Canadian and Quebec culture to foreign lands, **Guy Laliberté**. To highlight the remarkable work that various actors have contributed to the international dissemination of the performing arts, CINARS is awarding several other prizes as a part of its Biennale.

"The CINARS Biennale is more than ever a buzzing meeting environment for the performing arts. We gather here to share our knowledge and projects to support the evolution of the arts and to provide one-of-a-kind experiences to the public."

Over the years, the CINARS Biennale has become a pivotal hub and starting point for innumerable international tours of artistic companies. The Cirque du Soleil, the Cirque Éloize, La La Human Steps, Robert Lepage, O Vertigo, Compagnie Marie Chouinard, I Musici, and the 7 Doigts de la Main, among others, all passed through the conference at the beginning of their journeys. It is worth mentioning that the economic spinoffs of the 2014 Biennale were in the order of \$14.3 million in terms of revenue from the show sales for Quebec artistic companies alone.
